JUNE FEATURED SPEAKER

Founded by retired NASA female engineers in 2015, Launch STEM Careers is a project under the not-for-profit 501 (c)(3) NASA Alumni League. The project was started to inspire, encourage, and support young girls grades 4 through college seniors to pursue careers in Science Technology, Engineering, and Math, STEM. STEM professionals across Brevard County provide female students with mentoring and hands-on experiences to help them excel in STEM. Rita will discuss the Launch STEM Careers Project objectives, including training and mentoring, and the exciting progress that has been made during the past four years.

Rita Willcoxon is a retired executive engineering manager, whose career spanned roles with the Department of Defense, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration and General Electric.

After retirement, Rita co-founded the Launch STEM Careers Project in Brevard County for girls in grades 4 through college seniors, primarily working with Title I schools. Launch STEM Careers engages girls in project-like, hands-on activities to give them a better understanding of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math Careers.

After retiring from a 24-year career at NASA at the end of the Shuttle Program in 2011, Ms. Willcoxon worked for General Electric in their Transportation Division and served as a Global Engineering Leader re-

sponsible for the design, development and Arkansas with a Bachelor of Science in Indeployment of train signaling and intelligent dustrial Engineering and extended her educontrol systems for railroad and mining companies around the world.

Prior to retiring from NASA, Rita was the Director of Launch Vehicle Processing at NASA's John F. Kennedy Space Center in Florida, where she was responsible for processing and launching three space shuttles: Discovery, Atlantis and Endeavour, processing the Constellation vehicles, and managing a work force of approximately 5,400 civil service and contractor employees.

Preceding that appointment, Rita served as Deputy Director of Shuttle Processing and in other key senior leadership positions at Kennedy. In those roles, among others, she developed advanced spaceport and range technologies and systems in support of the agency's Space Shuttle, International Space Station and Expendable Launch Services Programs and in support of future NASA programs. In addition, she led several agency teams, including Reinvention of Station and Shuttle Utilization and the development of agency capability roadmaps in support of NASA's Exploration Mission and more. Over the years, Rita earned numerous awards, including the Silver Snoopy award, two Exceptional Achievement Medals, the Outstanding Leadership Medal and an Exceptional Service Medal.

During this time, Maria and her sisters acquired a small business in which Maria held the position of Chief Financial Officer. This led to involvement with the Women's Business Center at the Florida Institute of Technology, where their company was one of the first to participate in the business mentor program now known as IGNITE 360.

After the sale of their business, Maria began her career in the financial services industry, and returned to school at Eastern Florida State College where she completed her Bachelor's Degree in General Business Management. Maria is currently employed at First-Wave Financial and holds several financial service licenses.


